
From the Rector

The Curate's Corner

The Rev. Luke Wetzel – There is a treasure hidden in every Book of Common Prayer. It is not so much hidden, I suppose, as forgotten - shuffled past on the way to the Eucharistic liturgy - if in fact the Prayer Book is opened at all. I wish to commend it to you. The Daily Office consisting of "Daily Morning Prayer" and "Daily Evening Prayer" begins on page 35 of the Prayer Book. These services are one of the great treasures of our tradition. Praying the Daily Office is foundational to what it means to love God as an Anglican Christian.

I shared a little bit at a Wednesday night dinner last month about how I came to the Episcopal Church through a group of people who were saying the Daily Office during the week. The practice of opening and closing my working day with prayer changed the way I saw the world. It reminded me who I was as a follower of Jesus Christ. In the scriptures I encountered again and again the deep love that God has for the world and His desire that I live a just and holy life. In the prayers I practiced aligning my desires with God's will. In doing it each day, whether I felt like it or not, I was reminded that God was worthy of my time and prayers regardless of my mood.

The Daily Office isn't just something for priests or would-be priests either. In fact, it was written for regular lay folks. Thomas Cramner, the Archbishop of Canterbury in the 1530s-1550s assembled the Daily Office from the seven-fold prayer office of Benedictine monks and nuns. He simplified it into two offices, translated it into English,

and added a healthy dose of scripture. If you have ever wanted to pray more or read your Bible more, the Office is a perfect way to do both.

In England especially, for many years, it was a key responsibility of the priest in charge of a parish to see that the church was open morning and evening and that someone was leading the Office. We will be starting small at Trinity, saying Morning Prayer at 8:15 am, Monday through Wednesday beginning October 3. It is a short, 20-25 minute service of readings, canticles, the creed, and prayers. I heartily commend it to you. It has changed my life, utterly reordering my days. If you commit to it, I have faith that it will change yours also. I anticipate teaching on the Daily Office on future Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings.

I want to ask a favor of you this month. On Saturday, October 29, God and the bishop willing, I will be ordained a priest in Christ's one, holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church. I am a deacon now, but by the end of the month I will be a priest. This is a monumental occasion in my life and one that I am seeking to prepare for spiritually. If you are at all able to make it to Trinity at 8:15 am on one of those days this month to pray with me in anticipation of the bishop calling down the Holy Spirit on my head, I would be profoundly grateful. If that simply isn't something that your schedule allows, I covet your private prayers.

THE HARPER FAMILY

Bill Harper was born at Ft. Benning in 1934. He attended public schools, graduating from Columbus High School in 1952. He attended Auburn University for one year and joined the Army during the Korean War. After completing his training and Officer Candi-



date School, he took command of his first company at Ft. Benning. He was assigned to U.S. Army Europe, serving three years in Europe, including his second company command. Upon returning to the states, he was assigned to Ft. McClellan, AL, where he commanded his third company and met Helen, his future wife. He was then assigned to Ft. Bragg, NC and qualified for his Senior Parachutist Wings.

Bill completed his BA and MA degrees while stationed at the Pentagon. He completed the Command and Staff College in 1965 after which he was assigned to Vietnam. After returning to Ft. Leavenworth, he taught Division Operations for two years. He was reassigned to Ft. McClellan to command a battalion and then returned to Washington, DC to serve on the Army General Staff. Bill returned to Europe and served as J4 and J7 European Command. He retired from the Army as a Major General in 1986 after 33 years of service.

After retirement, while visiting his mother in Columbus, he joined Synovus Financial Corp. as a Senior Vice President, retiring after more than years.

Helen was born and raised in Anniston, AL, and is a graduate of Auburn University. She met Bill when he was stationed at Ft. McClellan. They became engaged and married in April of 1960. This past April they celebrated their 56th anniversary.

FAITH: Bill was Methodist until he was elected to the Vestry at an Episcopal church in Leavenworth, Kansas. When the priest learned that Bill was not Episcopalian, he asked Bill to accompany him to see the bishop in Wichita. He asked Bill if he wanted to be Episcopalian and Bill said that he did. The bishop put his right arm on Bill's shoulder

and said "Now you are!" and that is the interesting story of how he became Episcopalian.

FAMILY: Bill and Helen are proud parents of two daughters, and they have four wonderful grandchildren.

HOBBIES: Bill has served on the board of the Springer Opera House, is past president of Easter Seals of West Georgia, and has been an active member of Rotary Club since 1992. Bill and Helen both enjoy golf.

AT TRINITY: The Harpers have been active members of Trinity since 1986. Helen will complete her three year term on the Vestry this December. Representing the Vestry, she leads the monthly Parish Life meetings. They maintain perfect attendance at the early service where Bill serves as lay reader and usher.

We thank Bill for his many years of service to our country and to Helen for faithfully supporting him during his military career, and we appreciate their involvement at Trinity.

We Can Do All Things Through Christ

Kathryn Scoggins – Early in her career as a Social Psychologist, Carol Dweck, wanting to see how children coped with challenge, gave ten year olds several math problems that would be a little too difficult for them. She was astonished by the differences in the students that she saw. One group of students reveled in the problems. They said things like, "I love a challenge!" and "I was hoping this would be hard!" They believed that through practice, hard work, and creativity, their abilities could improve. They had a "growth mindset." The other students, however, saw the challenge as a sign that they had failed, that they were not as smart as they thought they were. Working hard and creative problem solving didn't matter, because, as far as the students believed, their abilities were set in stone. They had a "fixed mind set."

Research shows that this growth mindset is crucial to academic learning. But it is close to the heart of Christian education as well. From trouble with a friend to the death of a grandparent, we know that children face hard things every day. I hope that as they face challenges that seem too big for them, they remember David and Goliath. When they feel uncertain of their abilities, I hope that they remember that Moses, who led his people out of Egypt, felt the same way. And more than anything, I hope that they remember that no matter the challenges they face, they can do all things through Christ who strengthens them.
