## From the Rector

From the Rev. Timothy H. Graham, Rector

When I first encountered the Episcopal Church years ago, one of the most impressive features of my experience was the way Episcopalians prepared for worship. It was my experience in those days, that when I entered church on Sunday mornings I discovered the gathered faithful were sitting quietly in their pews or kneeling in silent prayer. This was a great change for me and different from other churches that I had been a part of. This time before worship was not a social time, but a time of quiet and prayer. The intentional preparation for worship adds so much to our experience of meeting God in beauty, awe, reverence, and praise.

In those minutes leading up to worship, we are invited into a time of preparing our hearts to meet God. There is often plenty of time to socialize and greet our neighbors after worship. We are invited to remain quiet before worship begins out of reverence for the house of God and the Lord's presence upon the altar. We also remain silent to avoid disturbing others who may be praying around us. "The Lord is in his holy temple; let all the earth keep silence before him." - Habakkuk 2:20


At Trinity Church, we have found that keeping silence before worship is a challenge. Because of the way that our building is designed, we do not have a proper indoor gathering place (narthex) as many Episcopal Churches do. Therefore, our choir members occupy the back pews of the church before worship begins, while ushers, acolytes, servers, and clergy are all bunched together in the same narrow entryway. Lately we have had the blessing of more choir members, more acolytes, and more people attending worship. Thus we have created a traffic jam at the entrance of the church, and we have made our time before worship a noisy one.

My hope is that we at Trinity can reclaim a tradition of silence before worship. I would like to try a change to make this time before worship more of a time of prayer and preparation. To deal with the limitations of our church building and our burgeoning altar party, we are instituting a liturgical change at the 10:30 am worship service. Starting on September 11, we will introduce this change. Before the worship begins, the choir will enter the chancel from the chapel side. The choir will then sing a piece of music before the processional hymn. This piece of music is called an introit, from the Latin word "introitus" which means entrance. This piece of music is designed to draw our attention to God, and reinforce this idea of keeping silence before worship. The procession into the church during the opening hymn will consist of acolytes, servers, and clergy. At the end of worship, the choir will then join the altar party in the procession out.

We hope this liturgical change will add to the beauty and reverence of our worship, and help us prepare for meeting God in prayer. Let us all keep silence before God.

## Let Us Walk Together

**The Rev. Luke Wetzel** – Grace be unto you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

I am so pleased to be joining Fr. Tim and the staff at Trinity as the new Curate. Before I say anything else, I need to say, "Thank you!" You are giving me the tremendous gift of a place to serve Christ and his Church as a new priest.

My wife Natalie, our 2-year-old daughter Frances, 1year-old son Andrew, Border Collie Amos, and I are settling into our apartment in Columbus. Natalie plans to continue to stay home with the kids for now. One of her passions is supporting nursing mothers. She is a La Leche League leader, and looks forward to getting involved with that organization here. Frances and Andrew both love going to the library and playing on the playground.

Natalie and I have been married for six years. We met while we were in college at Emory in Atlanta and married while I was in seminary at Duke in North Carolina. We lived for several years in Durham as part of an intentional community committed to serving the poor and engaging the traditional Anglican patterns of prayer and devotion. A little more than two years ago we moved to Thomasville where I served as Missioner at All Saints Episcopal Church and the Oak Street Episcopal Mission. All of us are called to make those things part of our lives so that through them, we might grow continually in our love of God and neighbor. As a deacon, soon-to-be priest of the church, I am called not just to do those things, but to invite, to equip, and to walk with you in so doing. That is just what I plan to do here.

Thank you for having me. I look forward to praying with you, feeding the hungry, talking with you, eating with you, baptizing, marrying, burying, anointing, and otherwise sharing life with you.

He left the service and enrolled at Florida State University, graduating in 1959 with a Bachelors in Secondary Education. He earned his Masters from Auburn University.

I read every word of that book. I spent hours and hours trying to make that first stitch. Try as I might, I just could not get it. Nothing turned out right. I attempted off and on for the next ten years with absolutely no success. Not even one row of knitting to show for it.

Until a few weeks ago. A few weeks ago I decided to try again, one more time. Only this time, after struggling, undoing and redoing stitches for an hour, I decided to try something different. I decided that instead of agonizing I would just go with what I thought was right. And, if my scarf ended up looking like a terrible mess - well, at least I had *done* something. And you know what? It was far from perfect, but it actually turned out alright.

I think our lives often look like the years I spent trying to learn to knit. We want so desperately to please God, to do the right thing. We read. We pray. We discern. And all


