We Have Exciting News!

– The Trinity Choir, with Dr. Moon at the organ, is moving toward completion of our new CD "Christmas at Trinity Church."

On Wednesday, September 19, we recorded 5 choral works. On Saturday, September 22, we recorded two great carols with the Trinity Brass and Timpani Ensemble followed by a brass and organ fanfare and postlude. The project moves into final production mode soon, with the CD booklet being designed and printed and the CDs being reproduced by a professional company.

We are all most grateful for the excellent collaboration with the brass and percussion players that always provide us with inspiring music at Christmas and Easter each year. Having them providing special music on this CD raises the level of musicianship.

The actual location recording is being supervised by Dr. Matthew McCabe of the Schwob School of Music faculty, whose mastery of the world of audio technology provides invaluable expertise and guidance, and Dr. Bradley Palmer of the Schwob School is in charge of final editing and post-production.

Finally, the most important component of this project is the excellent and expressive singing of the Trinity Choir. The singers have been rehearsing since late last spring and through the summer months, in order to be mic-ready during the jam-packed recording sessions. They have proven professional in every aspect, which has earned accolades from the brass and timpani players and Drs. McCabe and Palmer.

We should have the CDs in hand for purchase around the first of November, well in advance of Christmas. This CD will make a unique one-of-a-kind gift to family, friends, clients, and colleagues.

All best thanks for your continuing support of the choir through the Choral Scholar program, providing crucial financial support for deserving and talented young musicians. All proceeds from the CD sales will go directly to the scholars.
