### From the Rector

From the Rev. Timothy H. Graham, Rector

Dear Friends,

I am continuing my series of asking and answering a question about what it means to be an Episcopalian. This time let's discover the answer to a popular question asked a lot during this time of year...

### "Why doesn't the Episcopal Church sing Christmas songs until Christmas Eve?"

While it is true that we do not sing Christmas songs in the days leading up to Christmas, there are plenty of sights and sounds of the season found in our church. The season, however, is Advent, which is a season *before* Christmas that the secular world does not recognize.

It seems like there is a driving force in the universe to bring the celebration of the Christmas to us earlier and earlier each year. That driving force is greed. The commercialization of Christmas means that we see Christmas decorations appear in retail stores earlier each year. The merchants want us to

spend as much as we can on Christmas décor and presents, and if they start selling it earlier, we will buy more.

The church recognizes that the birth of Christ is most significant, and the meaning of this feast goes beyond all the singing and decorations and parties and gift giving. An event like the birth of Christ, the incarnation of the Word of God, deserves a season of preparation.

We refrain from singing songs of the savior's birth in the weeks leading up to Christmas because we are in a season of anticipation. The word Advent means "coming." In this season we prepare for the birth of Christ before we celebrate it on the evening of December 24. The season of Advent lasts for four weeks. In our worship we hear scripture about the coming of the messiah, and we also hear about his second coming at the end of the age when he will come again – not in a lowly birth in a manger, but in power and great glory. In the weeks leading up to Christmas we decorate the church with mostly greenery in simplicity. We are preparing our hearts for the big celebration that comes on the eve of the Feast of the Nativity when the church will be lavishly decorated. The colors that we use in church during Advent are not Christmas red, but blue or purple which remind us of the themes of repentance, fasting, royalty, and the sovereignty of Christ. Our advent wreath holds four candles, one for each of the Sundays in the season of Advent. We light an additional candle each week to help us understand that the light of Christ is coming into the darkness of the world. As we await the birth of Christ, we are reminded of the messages of hope for God's people, salvation, and the promise of a coming messiah.

The birth of Christ is marked on the calendar as December 25. This day begins the 12 days of Christmas, which marks the time between the birth of Christ and the coming of the Magi at the Feast of the Epiphany on January 6. We sing Christmas songs all throughout the 12 days of Christmas, when most of the world has already undecorated and moved past any notion of Christmas.

While most of the world starts decorating and celebrating Christmas earlier each year, the church maintains the ancient tradition of waiting during Advent and a celebrating a full season of Christmas between the dates of December 25 and January 6. Christmas means more to us when we prepare for it. We celebrate the coming of the Messiah, the Savior of the world! It might be helpful for us to take notice of the text of our Advent hymns. One of my favorites is Charles Wesley's beau-

"Let my prayer come before thee: incline thine ear unto my cry;" Psalm 88:2

We pray God's protection for those serving in battle.

### TRINITY SPOTLIGHT: Get to Know... Olivia "Libby" Wells



Libby's family attended St. John's Episcopal Church in Montgomery for generations. Her parents were married there. She was christened at St. John's and attended Sunday School there until family members, along with the Rev. Dr. Vernon McMaster, began to form a new church, St. Michael and All Angels, in Millbrook, AL. She completed confirmation at the new mission and was confirmed by

Bishop Murray at the old Church of the Holy Comforter on Goldthwaite Street in Montgomery, since St. Michael's did not yet have a building. Her family later moved to Texarkana, TX, where they were members of another wonderful, old downtown church.

Libby first attended Trinity in 1967 when she moved to Columbus to teach, first in Phenix City at Central Elementary and then in Columbus at Rothschild Jr. High. She met and married an Army Lieutenant. As soon as he returned from Vietnam, they were transferred to Germany where daughter, Anne, was born.

After six more moves, they returned to Ft. Benning in 1979 and once again began attending Trinity. By then they had two daughters - Anne (8) and Mary (5).

Libby says that two special members stand out in their memories of those years at Trinity: Dr. Gus Dudley and Nell Hudson. They were both very friendly and made her family feel so welcome. Nell even asked Libby to teach the 4-year-olds in Sunday School during the last year they were here. Anne was confirmed at Trinity in 1982 just before they were again assigned to Germany.

They returned to Columbus in 1986 in time for Anne to attend Pacelli High School her senior year. Libby assumed they would return to Trinity, but Mary had visited St. Thomas and wanted to join there. She enjoyed many years at St. Thomas, but the lure of the "old downtown church" was too strong, and she eventually returned to Trinity.

Libby never taught full-time again because of their many moves, caring for young children, and Army wife duties. She did, however, substitute at Department of Defense schools in Germany, in Highland Falls, New York, and while they were stationed at West Point. In 1981-82 she taught in the Basic Skills and high school completion program for soldiers at Ft. Benning. From 1987-1996 she worked as Department Secretary in Language and Literature at Columbus College. She resigned to be a full-time grandmother to her granddaughter, Morgan, when her daughter Mary returned to classes at CSU to obtain her B.A. and M.A. degrees.

**FAMILY:** Mary and her three children live in Phenix City, and Anne, her husband, and two sons live in Tuscaloosa.

**HOBBIES:** Now that she is single and retired, Libby enjoys participating in various activities with her friends: bridge, canasta, dominoes, and three book clubs. She also enjoys movies, attending plays at the Springer and the Horizon Theater in Atlanta, CSU concerts, and an occasional

trip. She is an active member in the Anne Elizabeth Shepherd Home Auxiliary, Colonial Dames 17th Century, and George Walton Chapter DAR. She looks forward to attending Chuck Bradshaw's Bible study on Tuesday mornings at Trinity. Libby attends the 10:30 service and is often accompanied by her handsome grandson, Nick. She also enjoys the annual Lenten Luncheons.

Libby has returned to Trinity three different times in her life, and says her reason for coming back is "My love for old, traditional downtown Episcopal churches like the ones I attended as a child." Now that she is retired and settled, we hope that she'll continue to worship in this great church. We are glad she returned, and we welcome her!





### **Sharing is Caring**
