### **Help Lay Out the Welcome Mat for VIP!**

Trinity will host several VIP families with children Sunday, September 16 - Sunday, September 23, and we need *YOUR* help in welcoming them! Valley Interfaith Promise is a great organization focused on getting families back on their feet.

Trinity has been involved with VIP in some capacity for a number of years. The premise of the program is that homeless families are given everything that they need to survive while they get back on their feet, and area churches provide all of the basic necessities. This involves a church hosting the families for a week and providing meals for them. During the day the families go to a day center, or to a job if they have one or looking for one if they don't, and to school.

VIP is a great local ministry that is having a positive impact on our community. We hope that you can find a way to be involved in this wonderful program. Please let Jerry Watts know if you are interested in helping in any of the following ways:

### **Meal Shifts and Meals**

Meal shifts are from 5pm to 8pm. The families will usually arrive between 5pm and 5:15 pm but his may vary based on their work schedule. They will usually eat between 5:30 or 6pm but this too may be variable. The shift itself and the meal can be split up between multiple volunteers.


### **Overnight Shifts**

The overnight shifts will go from 8pm to 7am. A bed will be provided and you do not need to stay awake, instead voluntters just need to be present in case the guests need you. VIP policy is that guests are to be out the door at 7am. Breakfast food for the families will be provided and will have to be made available by the volunteer.

### Weekend

Depending on the family's work or other plans our needs will vary for Saturday and Sunday. Daytime shifts may be necessary on Saturday and Sunday in addition to meal and overnight shifts.

### TRINITY SPOTLIGHT: Get to Know... Mary Dana Knight



She was born as an only child in Sturgis, Michigan, to an American mother and a naturalized British father. She had an idyllic childhood. It was a time when no house keys were needed, and you went home when the street lights came on. Her favorite memories were of summers spent at Klinger's Lake (still her "Tara") when, rain or shine, the

family moved to the lake on Memorial Day and returned home on Labor Day. Her grandchildren are the fifth generation to spend time there.

At age five Mary Dana caught the "traveling bug" from her parents who took her to destinations far and wide. Unfortunately her father died unexpectedly at age 45 when she was 12 years old. However, that did not stop the traveling; there were still trips to Alaska, Canada, South America, some island hopping thrown in, and there was also a fourmonth trip around the world!

After high school graduation, she went east to Pine Manor Junior College in Wellesley, Massachusetts. From there she spent a wondrous year in New York where she studied voice with the famous Italian dramatic tenor, Bernardo de Muro, with side classes at Julliard, Columbia. The following autumn she was off to Italy to continue her operatic studies. This culminated in her portraying Mimi in Puccini's opera La Boheme. She performed this role six times in Rome and Sicily.

The winter before, while skiing in New Hampshire, she met a handsome southerner, James Bartow Knight, III (fondly known as "Brother" to friends and family). As love blossomed, they became engaged that next Christmas while in England and married the following July. (So much for the singing career!) After a three-week Mexican honeymoon, she arrived in Columbus to begin her southern life. Having a double name and being from southern Michigan, she had high hopes of "making it."

**CAREER:** Mary Dana began her working career at age 55 as follows: She joined Jenny Lind Berry at the Butler's Pantry for six years, served as Executive Director of the Arthritis Foundation for six years, was employed by the Rothschild-Pound House twice for a total of six years, and the career for which she is well known, admired, and appreciated was as Executive Director of the historic Wynn House for a total of twelve years!

**FAITH:** Mary Dana is a "cradle" Episcopalian and has sung in an Episcopal choir (including Trinity) beginning at age 10 until age 75 wherever she was living. She loves Trinity and her three children were baptized here. Her two daughters were married at Trinity and both her son and husband's funerals were held here.

**FAMILY:** She was married for 45 years and loved every minute of it. She had three children: a son, Rex, who sadly passed away at age 10; two daughters, Beth and Tracy, who

were 14 years apart. Mary Dana has three grandchildren and two great-grandchildren of which she is so proud.

**HOBBIES:** Although she can no longer play, she always enjoyed tennis and golf. She still loves sailing, traveling, cooking, and entertaining. She also enjoys reading, playing bridge, Junto study club, and most of all - being with people of all ages.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT: Beginning in 1953 Mary Dana volunteered in many organizations such as the Girl's Club, Girl Scouts, Mardi Gras chairperson, serving on the board of the Anne Elizabeth Home, and was a Junior League Follies chairperson. She was also involved in the renovation of the Springer by planning a fundraiser of an evening with baritone Albert Lane; and performed in "Don't Make Waves," "Don't Make Waves II," "Guys and Dolls," and "Paint Your Wagon." She helped organize the Museum Guild and introduced their first silent auction. She also served as president of the first Symphony Guild.

Mary Dana is multi-talented and has graciously donated her talent, sharing her voice and culinary skills, to benefit many worthy organizations. We are grateful for her outstanding volunteer work in the community and are grateful to her for sharing her interesting life story!

### The Kids Are Back in (Sunday) School!




